

# SAFETY

## Protocols regarding COVID-19



Just as we did last summer, we are working diligently to ensure the best experience possible for campers during the upcoming summer. Prioritizing the health and safety of our campers, families, and staff members is our top priority. This summer, we will again adhere to the guidelines set forth by the Oregon Health Authority in regards to the programming that we will be permitted to offer. Please check our website (oregonjcc.org/daycamp) in the months to come for the most updated camp offerings for this summer.

Though summer 2021 state guidelines are in the process of being finalized, we expect that camp will run in a similar fashion as last summer with enhanced safety and disinfecting procedures, stable groups, and physical distancing. Our program will continue to expand throughout the summer as guidelines evolve. We are proud that our 2020 summer ran for ten weeks with zero reported COVID cases due to our diligent efforts.

## **STAY IN**

for drop-off and pick-up.
Our camp team will check
in with you, and escort your
camper in and out of the
car. If you are walking your
child to camp, stay in the

and our staff will assist you.

## HEALTH

Screening

All campers and staff are required to complete the verbal daily health screening and temperature check before entering the program. If a camper does not pass the screen or has a fever, all campers from that household/car are excluded from the program that day.



### **Small STABLE GROUPS**

Campers will be placed in small stable groups and will stay in the same group for the duration of the week.



## MASKS

#### Required

All camp staff and campers are required to wear masks at all times with the following exceptions: when spaced six feet apart outdoors, in the pool (if swimming is permitted), and at mealtimes.



## SANITIZATION Daily

Shared equipment will be properly cleaned and sanitized after use. Group equipment will be sanitized at the end of each day. Sanitation will happen at the end of the day for all areas.



## HAND WASHING Required

Handwashing and hand sanitizing will occur before and after activities and meals.



## COVID Cases

In the event of a confirmed case of coronavirus, we will coordinate with local health officials to determine the appropriate course of action.



## **COVID Exposure**

If a camper or staff has been directly exposed to a confirmed case of COVID-19, they must remain away from the program for 10 days, or 7 days with proof of a negative COVID test.



MJCC Camps have been a safe, active, much-needed outlet for our kids during this pandemic. The staff is very organized and well-trained and take every precaution to keep the kids safe while they're having fun. #### CLASSIC CAMP

#### Simcha, Kehila, Ruach, Kef + CIT Weekly: June 21 - August 20

Classic camp includes sports, cooking, Jewish culture, drama, nature, arts + crafts, and swimming (If guidelines permit). Campers often stay with the same counselor throughout the summer, providing a sense of consistency and helps to keep campers feeling safe and comfortable. Classic camp has a different theme each week! Campers create crafts, play games, and do activities that revolve around the theme. See pages 10 - 11 for the themes. We go outdoors as often as possible, but have the opportunity to stay indoors as well. All Classic campers celebrate Shabbat on Fridays.

#### **Swimming**

In previous years, our campers have pool time each day. It has always been one of the great benefits of MJCC Day Camp! Current state restrictions due to the pandemic have shifted many aspects of camp, including swimming. Our hope is that state guidelines continue to evolve and that our campers will have the opportunity to swim this summer. We have an outstanding aquatic facility that allows kids to enjoy the water safely under the close supervision of Red Cross certified lifeguards. #### Secret Agent Lab

Look out 007 - the Mad Science Spy Academy is in session! Step into the shoes of a spy in action from decoding messages, to metal detecting and using night vision goggles. Campers will have the opportunity to check out other spy equipment and even create their own edible messages learning how to communicate stealthily just like real spies.

#### Creative Contraptions The Inventor's Camp

Creative contraption warning! Junior inventors go on a journey of discovery from the real life inventions of daVinci, Edison and the Wright brothers to Isaac Asimov's dreams of future inventions. Each day campers are given a series of challenges which must be overcome using basic materials, simple machines, tips from famous inventors and the most important thing of all... their mind. With a little bit of ingenuity they'll construct catapults and forts and then lay siege, fabricate innovative flying contraptions, design their own gizmo prototypes and will even assemble a working light saber.

#### Microscopic Explorers

## Flexible Cancellations NEW + Refund Policy

Register early and reserve your child's spot in camp without the risk. If you must cancel camp for Covid related concerns, you may do so with a 100% refund. For non-Covid related cancellations, there will be a \$25 processing fee per child per camp. Non-Covid cancellations made within 14 days of the start of camp cannot be refunded.

MJCC Day Camp reserves the right to cancel camp programs due to low enrollment or unforeseen circumstances. Should cancellations occur, Day Camp staff will contact the parents/guardians prior to the camp and refunds or transfers will be given.
